Winnipeg is located in Treaty One Territory, the home and traditional lands of the Anishinaabe (Ojibwe), Ininew (Cree), and Dakota peoples, and in the National Homeland of the Red River Métis. Our drinking water comes from Shoal Lake 40 First Nation, in Treaty Three Territory.

Services we offer to help you reduce, reuse, and recycle in your home



Cart care & collection tips

- Moving your carts back onto your property as soon as possible after collection
- Between collections, store your carts in a safe place on your property
- Write your address on your carts
- Put your carts out by 7 a.m.
- Keep carts an arm's length (one metre) apart and away from any structures
- Empty the contents of boxes and containers before placing in your cart
- Do not jam or pack items into your cart items should fall out easily when emptied into truck
- If you move homes, please leave your carts at the residence
- Only put accepted items in your recycling cart. Including unaccepted items in your cart leads to cost increases. Find out what is accepted at winnipeg.ca/whatgoeswhere

Walk-up service

If you are unable to bring your carts out on collection day, you may be eligible for our walk-up service. With this service, our collectors will walk up to your home, empty the carts, and return them.

You can upgrade your collection services additional fees.

Extra garbage & large item pickup

Extra garbage or large items that do not fit in your garbage cart can be **scheduled for pickup** for an extra fee.

You can request for a pickup for the following items:

- Up to three standard garbage bags per pickup
- Large items like furniture or mattresses (limit of 10 per pickup)
- Large appliances like stoves, refrigerators, or washing machines (limit of 10 per pickup)

The **4R Winnipeg Depot** locations also accept certain items. Visit winnipeg.ca/4RDepot or read the 4R Winnipeg Depot section of this guide to learn what materials are accepted.

Extra recycling

Extra recyclables that do not fit in your blue cart at home can be dropped off at any **4R Winnipeg Depot** or **community recycling depot** within the city. Please make sure all boxes and containers are empty before you drop them off.

4R Winnipeg depots

4R Depots are recycling facilities where Winnipeg residents can drop off materials that can be reduced, reused, resold, or composted for **free**.

- Gasoline (in jerry can)

Do not toss items with these symbols in your carts, take them to a 4R Winnipeg collection depot for safe disposal.

Recyclable and reusable materials:

- Blue cart recyclables
- Bikes
- Ceramics
- Clean lumber
- Glass
- Large appliances
- Empty large plastics
- Tires
- Rubble and masonry
- Scrap metal
- Mattresses**

Compostable materials:

- Clean fill
- Leaves and grass
- Tree waste (branches, logs, stumps)
